BEWARE OF PET THEFT

Pet theft has become a real problem; stolen pets are used in unimaginable ways as "bait" to train fighting dogs, for live practice, for violent thrills, or even sold for research to unscrupulous dealers. Protect your pet:

- Never leave your pet tied outside a store it takes ten seconds to grab a pet. It's also illegal.
- Do not leave your pet alone in the car, even if it is locked.
- Do not leave your pet alone in your back yard
- Never allow your pets to roam streets and alleys unattended.
- Always keep your pet on a leash in a public area. Someone can jump out of a car and grab your off-leash pet. It's been done. It's also the law.
- Always make sure that your child is accompanied by a responsible adult when walking the dog.
- When you have to leave your pet, make sure it is in the care of someone who is as careful as you would be, and will follow your rules.
- Always report pet theft to the police: call 311 to file a report or 911 if the theft is in progress.

TASTE OF TALLULAH'S

We've included a review from a roving restaurant reviewer. He drove from Indiana to dine in Lincoln Square, and here's what he had to say about Tallulah.

Recently I visited Tallulah on Lincoln Avenue, and was ever so pleasantly surprised to find it definitely a destination restaurant, rather than a neighborhood eatery. The setting is simple, but nicely done, and the food and presentation of food were impressive.

The starters chosen by both my companion and me were generously proportioned and attractively plated. I chose bulgogi pork belly with kimchee, which was very tasty and artistically set out. My companion's beet salad was presented very stylishly and was reportedly excellent. Similarly, her artichoke napoleon and my lamb loin were well prepared and picturesquely presented.

And the desserts! My choice was an ancho chile chocolate mousse cake, an unusual combination of flavors, and very tasty. My companion, who has eaten creme brulee in many states and several countries pronounced the crust on her chai creme brulee the perfect thickness. (who knew?).

Service seemed a trifle rushed, perhaps an economic necessity. Prices are moderate, and less than I had expected; the bill for two (starters, entrees, desserts and a glass of wine each) was about one hundred dollars. Even with the price of gas, I'll be back.
