Summer held on a long time, and for that we're all grateful. Even when the temperatures were still in the 80s people knew it wasn't going to last much longer, and most conversations started being about what to do when winter came for its long, long visit. I like to think we've still got a little autumn left, but just to get you thinking, here's a few ideas for getting out and about without the need for arctic protection....YET.

If you love Halloween season and want to stretch it out, the annual Day of the Dead exhibition runs through December 14 at The National Museum of Mexican Art (www.nationalmuseumofmexicanart.org). This year's exhibition "La Vida sin Fin," honors the 40th anniversary of the Tlatelolco massacre. Exhibition admission free. The Museum of Science and Industry is a favorite for kids and adults (www.msichicago.org) See "Fast Forward: Inventing the Future," which gives us the latest in food replicators and shirts that can transmit sensations. Also, tour the "Smart Home"—a temporary single-family home decked out with the latest in green technology.

For something outside the regular museum loop, visit the Mitchell Museum of the American Indian (www.mitchellmuseum.org). The Museum has an extensive permanent collection that includes archaeological, ethnographic and art objects of North American and Canadian tribes. See baskets, masks, ceremonial dolls, wooden carvings and other historic items that span the centuries. Kids Craft Morning Workshops: 10:30 a.m.-12 p.m.: November 8 Dream catchers; November 22, Miniature woven rugs; December 13, Coup Sticks. The Native American Holiday Bazaar is held on December 6 and 7 10:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

And last, if you want to enjoy the night sky without the crazy winter wind, consider The Adler Planetarium's (www.adlerplanetarium.org) Far Out Fridays. The 1st Friday of every month you can enjoy the spectacle of the starry sky and take advantage of the many activities for children and families, telescope viewing of the night sky, unlimited shows in the historic Sky Theater and Defniti® Space Theater, and Doane Observatory tours. You can also bring with and learn how to use your new or old telescope on November 7, 4:30-10:00 p.m.; December 5, 4:30-10:00 p.m.; January 2, 4:30-10:00 p.m.
